KINS Faculty recommend replacing this with HLSC 1103 Personal Health and Safety in the KINSBS Pre-Professional Concentration: KINS faculty also recommended dropping PEAC 1621 Fitness Concepts in the KINSBS Pre-Professional Concentration stating that this class is not necessary for the EXPP curriculum. KINS faculty also recommend adding HLSC 2662 Terminology for the Health Professional as part of their required curriculum within their program in both KINSBS (Pre-professional Exercise Science and Applied Exercise Science and adding a required "neuro-science" class either POSC 4923 Brain and Behavior or PSYC 4183 Behavioral Neuroscience or BIOL 4793 Introduction to Neurobiology in the Pre-Professional Concentration only. Note adjustment of hours will be in "electives" (no longer from a selected list or advisor approved - just electives.
