Bioenergy and Sustainable Technology Graduate Certificate Program

A 15 credit hour multi-disciplinary program developed collaboratively with University of Arkansas, Kansas State University, Oklahoma State University and South Dakota State University as part of the Great Plains AG*IDEA Consortium. Admission to the certificate program will follow the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville Graduate School requirements.

Students seeking the graduate certificate will take 9 credit hours of core courses, and 6 credit hours of elective courses either in the Conversion Track, the Feedstock Track or the Sustainability Track.
