Four changes are proposed:

- Two new courses are added as required courses to all three concentration areas in HDFS. These two courses are HESC 2453
   Analytical Approaches to Research in HDFS I and HESC 2463 Analytical Approaches to Research in HDFS II. These
   courses eliminate the research methods and statistics requirements in the Lifespan concentration. In the Child Development
   and Birth to Kindergarten concentration, the additional requirements will reduce the general elective requirements.
- 2. Two courses (with an additional two lab sections) are now required in the Child Development concentration. These are HESC 4332/4332L and HESC 4342/4342L. This reduces general electives by 8 hours.
- 3. The requirement for an additional three hours in English, journalism, or foreign language is removed and electives are increased by three hours in all concentrations.
- 4. Remove HESC 3763L from the list of Lifespan and Child Development electives.

- 1. The courses will be designed to provide students the analytical and critical thinking skills needed to understand and critically evaluate social science literature. They will provide students with the tools they need to develop and implement basic research projects or program evaluations. These changes are also needed so that undergraduate students will be much better prepared for graduate studies. We have proposed these as 2000-level courses and plan on requiring them early in students' programs of study so that, in our upper-division courses, students will be able to competently engage with the research literature.
- 2. These courses will provide students in the Child Development concentration with additional lab experiences that will prepare them for careers and for additional studies in child development.
- 3. This requirement is additional to the requirement needed to complete the communications core requirements. Removing this requirement does not preclude students from taking additional courses in this area, but it enlarges the range of courses that students can take and allows them more freedom to design their course of study.
- 4. This course is no longer taught and should not be included in the electives.

Child Development (CDEV)

The focus on children covers issues from the prenatal to early adolescence. Graduates may work as preschool teachers, day-care directors, specialists in the field of child life, and as child advocates.
