Changing of course names were due to the changes made in Dietetics (HESC 1213, 2112/2111L, & 2203). HESC 1603 (Introduction to Hospitality) was added to the HESC core to provide a hospitality educational experience that was not previously offered to students. CATE 4803 has been added as the housing component in place of the deleted HESC 4813 course.

The general human environmental sciences curriculum serves students seeking a background in all of the subject-matter areas of human environmental sciences. The general curriculum prepares students for careers in social services, business, and the Cooperative Extension Service. Liberal elective hours allow students to select courses and programs to meet individual needs.

Students may be certified by the Arkansas State Board of Education to teach family and consumer sciences in Arkansas public schools by combining the pre-professional education courses as electives and completing the Master of Arts in teaching (M.A.T.) degree requirements. (See M.A.T., page 235). At the beginning of the sophomore year, students should consult with their advisers to schedule the general education and pre-professional education courses.
