1. All references to 124 degree credit hours changed to 120 as required by the Act 747 mandate.
2. Inserting STAT 2303 as an acceptable higher-level math course for the JOUR major. Knowledge of statistics would be beneficial to journalism students in their future journalistic careers, and therefore should be included in the list of higher-level math courses which satisfy the major's requirement. Furthermore, Ad/PR students are required to take MKTG 3433 Intro to Marketing. WCOB has a new prerequisite for MKTG 3433, WCOB 1033 Data Analysis. They will accept, for Ad/PR students, STAT 2303 to satisfy that prerequisite.
3. Making it clear that students who take a cultural/diversity-approved HIST course can "double-dip" and allow that to satisfy both the upper-level HIST requirement and the cultural/diversity requirement. The department needed to insert this language for clarity, and consistency in interpretation.
4. Removing the reference of JOUR 405V Special Journalism Seminar and replacing with courses that have been recently developed and have their own, unique catalog numbers. Including language that if a cultural/diversity-approved JOUR course is taken to fulfill the cultural/diversity requirement, it can also be used to meet a JOUR elective requirement in one of the JOUR sequences. JOUR 405V is no longer needed after the formal creation of the JOUR 3263 African Americans in Film and JOUR 4923 History of the Black Press.
5. The senior writing requirement will now be fulfilled by the completion of JOUR 4981. Specifically requiring this course adds one credit hour to the hours required by the major. Historically, students registered for JOUR 498V, and under the supervision of a JOUR faculty member, developed a paper suitable to fulfill the department's senior writing requirement. But the course was never specifically required in the department's major requirements. JOUR 498V has been converted to JOUR 4981 and will now be a specifically required course for all majors to formalize the department's oversight of the senior writing requirement.
6. Four hours of electives are being removed from each JOUR 8-semester sequence to bring the overall number of required hours down to 120.

News/Editorial: JOUR 2013, JOUR 3013, JOUR 3123, and either JOUR 3023 or JOUR 4553 are required, plus any four additional journalism courses. It is recommended that one course choice be an internship.
Broadcast: JOUR 2032/2031L, JOUR 3072/3071L, JOUR 4863, and JOUR 4873 are required, plus any four additional journalism courses. It is recommended that one course choice be an internship and another choice be JOUR 4883.
Advertising/Public Relations: JOUR 3723, JOUR 3743, JOUR 4143, JOUR 4423, and JOUR 4453 are required, plus any three additional journalism courses. It is recommended that one course choice be an internship. Also required are MKTG 3433 and MKTG 3553. Students seeking admission to the Ad/PR Sequence must have an overall GPA of 2.5 or higher: 1) to be admitted to the Ad/PR Sequence, and 2) to enroll in JOUR

3723 and JOUR 3743. Ad/PR Sequence students are required to earn a grade of "B" or higher in both JOUR 3723 and JOUR 3743 to qualify to take all upper level Ad/PR sequence courses. Students may retake JOUR 3723 and JOUR 3743 only once to earn a grade of "B" or higher.
Writing Requirement: Successful completion of JOUR 4981 with a grade of "C" or better satisfies the Fulbright College Writing Requirement for journalism majors. Students should consult with their faculty advisers for information on how to fulfill the college writing requirement.
