After having advised now for nearly a year on the new major requirements, the department in WLLC voted to make changes to the language majors and further voted that each language major must have the same courses. This is primarily to eliminate some odd interactions between additional major requirements and the state minimum core, which were not anticipated: for example, the fact that a 2003-numbered world language course counts in the core under humanities and also in the new major requirements as a humanities course; or the fact that the intricacies and inconsistencies of the advanced english exemption policy make it too complicated and impractical to implement fairly. The intent is also to make our major requirments more directly pertinent to world language issues. The removal of 4 general elective credits to reduce the overall degree hours required to 120 is due to a state-wide mandate.
