Insert here a statement of the exact changes to be made: **We propose to change the courses required for the CLST major. We are removing COMM 1313 and ENGL 2003 (or 2013) as required courses. We are adding CLST 1003 and 1013 as required courses for all majors. We are also specifying that the 6 hours of required humanities courses must be fulfilled by WLIT 1113 *and* PHIL 2003. WLIT 2323 Greek and Roman Mythology is being re-added to the list of major courses.**

Four hours of general elective credits are being removed from the CLSTBA 8-semester plan. The total number of degree credit hours required will be changed from 124 to 120 hours. No changes are being made to the actual major requirements to accommodate this 4 credit reduction.

We want to be sure that CLST majors take both introductory CLST courses (CLST 1003 Greece and CLST 1013 Rome), so they can have a foundation in both areas. Until now it has been possible for students to graduate without having either course. These changes will not affect other degree programs. Furthermore, we want all of our students to take both PHIL 2003 and WLIT 1113, since they both contain important material from the ancient Greek and Roman worlds -- we do not want them to choose one or the other. In order not to raise the number of hours for the major, we choose to eliminate the requirement that CLST majors take COMM 1313 and ENGL 2003 or 2013. WLIT 2323 Greek and Roman Mythology dropped off the list of Classical Studies major courses at some point, but it has been a major course for 30 years. The removal of 4 general elective credit hours from the 8-semester plan is due to compliance with Act 747.

Honors students who complete the HUMN 1114, 1124, 2114, 2124 (H2P) sequence will have fulfilled the World Civilization HIST 1113 and 1123 requirement for this major as well as the major's 6-hour Humanities requirement (equivalent of WLIT 1113 and 1123, with PHIL 2003 waived).

6 – World Civilization (Social Sciences) to be fulfilled by **HIST 1113** and **1123**

This fulfills 6 hours of social science university/state core; the remaining 3 hours in the social science core must be fulfilled by a non-HIST social science university/state core course.)

Honors students who complete the HUMN 1114, 1124, 2114, 2124 (H2P) sequence will have fulfilled the World Civilization HIST 1113 and 1123 requirement for this major as well as the major's 6-hour Humanities requirement (equivalent of WLIT 1113 and 1123).

Students should also complete appropriate courses from the following:
