The organization of the section Honors Roots of Culture, Philosophy, Humanities Colloquium was confusing. It has been restructured to list PHIL 2003H as a required course. The option of completing HUMN 2124 or an Honors Colloquium in Humanities is given separately to make the Humanities Colloquium requirement parallel to the other degree programs which waive the Humanities Colloquium for students who complete the fourth course in the H2P sequence (HUMN 2124).

Social Science requirement: the list of classes from which to choose a Social Science requirement are all honors courses with the exception of the option to take both ECON 2013 and ECON 2023 (non-honors). At one time, ECON 2013 & ECON 2023 were allowed in place of a single honors-level social science course, because honors offerings of the ECON classes were not regularly offered. Today, ECON 2013 and 2023 are regularly offered as honors courses. Students pursuing a bachelor of fine arts are required to complete fewer honors classes compared to the number required for the B.A. and the B.S. 4-year honors programs; therefore, it is important that the social science requirement be fulfilled by honors-level coursework.

Option 2: Colloquia in Social Sciences--the statement "Must be selected from two different areas of social sciences." is being removed because it is confusing and seems to indicate that two social science colloquia are required. Originally, the statement was intended to require students to choose a social science colloquium from a discipline other than the one from which the honors social science requirement was fulfilled. In practice, students have been allowed to satisfy the social science colloquium from any social science field. This statement should be removed so that substitutions or exceptions are not necessary.

Requirements for Departmental Honors: Specific academic requirements including course work, participation in departmental honors colloquia or seminars, and independent study projects are established by the faculty of the individual departments or study areas and are approved by the Honors Council. However, all departmental honors students must have a 3.5 cumulative grade-point average, complete and defend an honors thesis, and take 12 hours (which may include six hours of thesis) in Honors Studies.
