HESC 3604 will become HESC 3603 (lecture) and HESC 3601 (lab) in 2013. The lab portion is not necessary to meet the Accreditation requirements in the Dietetics concentration, so may be eliminated. An additional 3 hours of elective credit will be omitted to bring the Dietetics concentration into compliance with Act 747. Accreditation requirements do not currently accommodate any other elimination or combination of course requirements, so elective hours must be reduced (from 12-22 to 9-19). The course content in the General Nutrition minor is a duplication of course requirements in the Dietetics concentration, therefore, students choosing the DIET concentration will not be eligible for the minor.

Dietetics (DIET)

Dietetics is for the student who intends to become a Registered Dietitian (RD),

dietetic internship. Upon successful completion of the post-baccalaureate dietetic internship, the graduate is eligible to take the Registration Exam, the board examination for the RD credential. Graduates of this program who choose not to apply for a post-baccalaureate dietetic internship are eligible upon completion of the Bachelor's degree to take the board examination to become a Dietetic Technician, Registered (DTR).

Students majoring in Food, Human Nutrition and Hospitality with a concentration in Dietetics are not eligible for the General Nutrition minor due to course duplication.
