In an effort to better prepare our graduates for the changing job market, the German and French sections are instituting a new MA requiring six hours of technology / pedagogy courses within the 36 hours required for the traditional German and French MA degrees. Currently, many students elect to take these courses, but this change would formally require the courses as a six hour core for a new combined M.A. in Modern Language with a track in German or French. As these courses are currently already being offered, the changes would require no additional investment of resources.
