Each student in the professional program in architecture is required to complete an approved off-campus study program. Approved programs include a semester in Rome and a summer design studio in Latin America. Students participating in off-campus programs may present only three elective hours of course work per semester spent away from the Fayetteville campus for professional elective credit. All other elective courses will be used to fulfill free elective requirements.
