For the BA, Art Studio concentration and the BA, Art History concentration, newer ARHS classes are being added to the list of classes which may satisfy the departmental art history requirements. Also, the Writing Requirement is being updated to include the newer ARHS courses which can satisfy the Fulbright College Writing Requirement.
2. We are fundamentally changing the ARTS foundation curriculum. There will be an increase in the credit requirement from five courses making up the 15 credits in foundations (ARTS 1013, 1313, 1323, 2013, and 2313) to two courses (ARTS 1919C and ARTS 1929C) totalling 18 credit hours.
3. For the Art, BA Studio Concentration, we are decreasing the number of required electives credit hours to be taken outside of the department from 15 credit hours to 6 credits.
4. For the Art, BA Studio Concentration, we are increasing the primary media area credit obligation from 3 courses [9 credit hours] to 4 courses [12 credit hours].
5. We are changing the ARTS 4921 Senior Portfolio Review obligation to reflect the course change to a 3-credit course, ARTS 4923 Professional Development and indicating that the course is to be taken in the student's area of concentration.

The changes to the Art, BA Studio concentration will result in a decrease in 1 credit hour of major requirements. There is no net change in hours required for the Art, BA Art History concentration.

1. For the BA, Art Studio concentration and the BA, Art History concentration, newer ARHS classes are being added to the list of classes which may satisfy the departmental art history requirements. Also, the Writing Requirement is being updated to include the newer ARHS courses which can satisfy the Fulbright College Writing Requirement. This is being done for clarity and proper advising.
2. We are fundamentally changing the ARTS foundation curriculum. This will be an increase in the credit requirement from five courses making up the 15 credits in foundations (ARTS 1013, 1313, 1323, 2013, and 2313) to two courses (ARTS 1919C and ARTS 1929C) totalling 18 credit hours. This will create more cohesion in the curriculum and within the freshman art student body. This new curriculum will increase long-term success in the entire art program, and in turn positively impact the four-year graduation rate. The new foundation courses will also increase measurable learning outcomes, replace outdated courses, decrease redundant teaching concepts in multiple required classes, and halt upperclassman from taking foundations classes in their senior year.
3. For the Art, BA Studio Concentration, we are decreasing the number of required electives credit hours to be taken outside of the department from 15 credit hours to 6 credits. This requirement was confusing and was not aiding value to the BA degree program.
4. For the Art, BA Studio Concentration, we are increasing the primary media area credit obligation from 3 courses [9 credit hours] to 4 courses [12 credit hours]. This better prepares the student for a future art career.
5. We are changing the ARTS 4921 Senior Portfolio Review obligation to reflect the course change to a 3-credit course, ARTS 4923 Professional Development and indicating that the course is to be taken in the student's area of concentration. This better prepares the student for a future art career with the credit increase and the area faculty teaching students in their field, about their field.
All of these changes are implemented due to the Department of Art's future consideration in NASAD accreditation (National Association of School of Art and Design).

Credit for advanced studio classes in the department is contingent upon presentation of a portfolio of works created in a college-level class equivalent to the class the student is seeking credit for in the Department of Art. Professors in the relevant studio area will evaluate portfolios and determine transfer credits.
