ADHE requires the Bachelor of Arts degree to contain a minimum of 20 hours of 3000/4000 level courses in the major field of study. Currently the Bachelor of Arts in music only requires the completion of 15 hours of 3000/4000 level courses: MUTH 3603, MUTH 3613, MUHS 3703, MUHS, 3713, and MUHS 4253. Many BA students would likely reach the minimum 20 hours of major-related courses by participating in ensemble sections in the junior and senior vear (junior and senior-level ensembles are numbered at the 3000 and 4000 level). Students who complete their minimum 4 hours of ensembles at the 3000 and 4000 level). Students who complete their minimum 4 hours of ensembles at the 3000 and 4000- level or complete 1 remaining hour of 3000+ music courses to complete 20 hours of 3000+ major-related coursework. This is why the 3000+ music elective requirement is stated as a range. The total number of 3000+ music clectives only needs to be enough to ensure that the student completes a minimum total of 20 hours of 3000+ music courses. The addition of the Women's Chorus to the ensembles section by vocal music majors will allow our choral ensemble directors to balance female/male ratio in our mixed vocal ensembles. Pursuant to the addition of Women's Chorus as fulfilling a degree requirement, Women's Chorus should be included as also fulfilling the requirement that "All music majors are required to enroll in MUEN 1411 Concert Choir during the first year of residence."
