THTR 2513. Drafting for the Theatre (Fa Even Years). 3 Hours.

Through instruction and laboratory exercises, the student will study and develop basic technical drawing and graphic skills necessary to communicate design ideas to fellow artisans. Both production and design oriented drafting will be explored using both hand drafting and computer techniques.

Prerequisites: THTR 1323, THTR 1231L or consent of the Instructor

THTR 4123 Rendering for the Theatre (SP Even Years)

Provides the fundamentals of visual communication for theatre in a variety of media and techniques. Investigation of traditional drawing and painting methods and materials used by theatrical designers. Application of computer technology and software training in creating documents necessary to the theatrical process. Prerequisites: THTR 2313

d. Goals and objectives of program option: There are two major goals for the redesigned B.A. degree in theatre. We hope to provide a clear path to graduation in 4 years and want to prepare our graduates for the rigors of the 21st century entertainment industry. Secondly, this new curriculum more closely aligns with the Top 50 peer institutions that we consulted, as well as the national standards set forth by the National Alliance of Schools of Theatre (NAST).

e. Expected student learning outcomes: We expect that students in this emphasis area will be better poised to compete in the design and technology field while retaining the benefits of a liberal arts program.
