Currently, for students in the combined Journalism/Political Science major, pursuing the News/Editorial Concentration, Public Affairs Reporting Track, JOUR 3023 News Reporting II is a required course. We are making a change to allow students the option of selecting one of 3 courses to satisfy this line-item requirement so that the line reads

JOUR 3023 News Reporting II or JOUR 4503 Magazine Writing

or JOUR 4553 Magazine Editing and Production I

Description and justification of the request:

Providing three options for the advanced course in the News-Editorial concentration allows students to obtain specialized training in either advanced reporting skills for writing print or digital news stories (JOUR 3023), writing print or digital longer-form feature or human-interest stories (JOUR 4503), or editing and producing stories, visuals and graphics for digital or print publications (JOUR 4553). These same options are available for Journalism majors in the News-Editorial Sequence; we want to allow combined majors in the News-Editorial area the same options so they can select the specialized training they desire as well. In addition, providing three options for the advanced course in the concentration gives students more flexibility in meeting requirements for the major as well as more options in courses they may select.
