	Justification	Through systematic analysis of the competencies needed by certified agriculture teachers and the skills they master through the current Agricultural Education program, we have identified a gap in curriculum development and assessment. This course is designed to fill that gap by giving students and understanding of and experience in the development of a full curriculum document for a course. The course will also enable students to design quality assessment pieces that align with learning objectives and then interpret assessment results and adjust teaching accordingly. This course is designed specifically for agricultural education students, as elective subjects have different core content inclusion requirements than other courses.	AGED 3163, Curriculum Development and Assessment Techniques, has been taught for the past three springs and has been highly impactful in preparing students to plan curriculum during their teaching internship. We have continued to observe students struggle with the responsibilities of the internship; the time required to simultaneously plan lessons and teach them has reduced students' ability to carefully reflect on their teaching experiences before they plan the next day's lessons. Class and programmatic changes, as well as a shift in our procedures in working with supervising teachers, has enabled students to work with their supervising teachers much earlier than in previous semesters and opened up the opportunity for students to take a one-hour lab class in the fall before their internship. During this lab, they can now work with their supervising teachers to apply the principles of AGED 3162 in constructing unit plans and assessments to use during their internship. This preparation will allow students more time to focus on creating quality unit and lesson plans, as well as enable them to focus more on the reflective learning process intended through the teaching internship.
