The GRE is viewed as a discouraging factor for working professionals and there is no data to indicate a GRE score is an indicator of success. The requirement of 3.0 and professional experience has been a good indicator of success in the MSOM and MSE programs. The MSEM program is professional masters degree program. The director will look for various criteria to consider whether requiring the GRE for those applicants with a GPA below 3.0. A Professional Engineer certification, depth of experience and level of responsibility are a few areas. In a few unusual cases, a student going directly to a professional master's program with a history of rigorous academic accomplishment may be considered to enter the program. The Pre-HRWD Math requirement can also satisfy the University's core requirement. The faculty determined that students will only need to complete 3 hours of math chosen from the list of four courses: MATH 2183, MATH 2053, STAT 2303, or MATH 1313. If students have completed one of the four courses as part of the University core, no additional math courses are needed. Clarification for the catalog.</p>	<p>We reduced the required number of hours for the major requirements to 45 from 51. The two 3-hour HRWD classes removed from the requirements for the degree were moved to elective hours. The total number of elective hours was changed from 34 to 40. To provide more flexibility for the students to complete the degree. The two 3-hour HRWD classes that were moved to electives are still available to students who may need the classes.</p> <p>We also updated the language for what is acceptable as Continuing Education Units.
