This program will be the first post-master's certificate program designed specifically for school-based speech-language pathologists (SLPs) in the United States. School districts across the United States often provide a pay increase for 12-15 hours of additional graduate-level coursework completed. This program would meet the goal of additional graduate-level coursework, selected coursework will be registered and counted toward the required professional development for SLPs by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, and the content of the coursework for this program provides deep training in specialty areas of speech-language pathology seen in school settings. The overall goal of this program is to improve the knowledge base of school-based speech-language pathologists in specialty areas that will correspondingly improve the quality of speech therapy service provision in educational settings. The program is designed for individuals with a master's degree.

Advanced School-Based Speech-Language Pathology Post-Master's Certificate

Program Description

The post master’s Advanced School-Based Speech-Language Pathology Certificate is an online 15-hour graduate program targeting school-based speech-language pathologists who seek to build their content expertise and improve their career mobility. The overall goal of this program is to improve the preparation of school-based speech-language pathologists that will correspondingly improve the quality of speech therapy service provision in educational settings.

Admission Requirements

The program is designed for individuals with a master’s degree in speech-language pathology or related field in communication disorders from a program accredited by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA).

Program Costs

We anticipate minor costs to implement and sustain the proposed program.

- One adjunct faculty will be needed for this program; existing Communication Sciences & Disorders faculty will serve as faculty for four of the courses of the certificate program. There will be a need for 3 adjunct lecturers to teach undergraduate courses that are currently being taught by CDIS faculty.
- No new library resources and costs are required; students will access existing resources via the Libraries’ website.
- No new or renovated facilities are required because the program will be delivered online
- No new instructional equipment is required for this online program.
- The program will use the existing distance delivery infrastructure. Global Campus may provide course development monies to individual faculty members.
- No additional cost is anticipated.

Library Resources There are no additional University of Arkansas library resources needed. The resources that students will need are already included in the collections and subscriptions related to the Communication Sciences and Disorders program. Since the program is a web-based program and students are not on campus they will access resources through electronic means. Throughout the degree program, students will be able to access already existing resources, including the University of Arkansas Library's education holdings.

Instructional Facilities NA

Faculty Resources The proposed program is supported by existing faculty expertise in the Communication Sciences and Disorders program within the Department of Rehabilitation, Human Resources, and Communication Disorders. These faculty members will use their expertise to adapt existing courses for the community college environment. An additional adjunct faculty member will be recruited for one course of the online certificate program and 3 additional adjunct faculty members will be recruited to teach current on-campus undergraduate level courses from which current faculty will be pulled when they teach the online courses for this program.

<p>The Communication Sciences and Disorders program would like to offer 5 advanced graduate-level courses through an online certificate program for school-based speech-language pathologists (SLPs) as a means to communicate contemporary evidence-based practices in educational settings. Currently, there is no post-master's certificate program directed specifically at school-based SLPs in the United States.</p>	<p>SLPs in school settings often struggle to find adequate professional development and currently have only merit or experience raises as options for advancement. This certificate program would not only provide school-based SLPs increased knowledge in specialty areas in the field of communication sciences and disorders, but it would also provide school-based SLPs a means by which to increase their salary because school districts often offer an increase in pay upon the completion of an additional 12-15 hours graduate-level coursework.</p>
