Fulbright College Writing Requirement: Prior to graduation, each history major must submit a substantial research or analytical paper with a grade of "A" or "B" from a 3000-level or higher HIST course to a departmental advisor. The required senior capstone seminar, <u>HIST 4893</u>, is designed to give history majors the opportunity and guidance to produce a paper to meet this requirement, but students may also submit a paper from another HIST course or from satisfactory completion of an honors thesis.

1College Honors students must take <u>HIST 1113H</u>, <u>HIST 1123H</u>, <u>HIST 3973H</u> and at least 3 credit hours of <u>HIST 399VH</u>. College Honors students may not apply more than 6 credit hours of <u>HIST 399VH</u> to the history major.

2Honors students must take HIST 3973H instead of HIST 4893. Under special circumstances, on a case by case basis, the program director may allow Honors students to take HIST 4893.

3Students may not receive credit for both HIST 3383 and HIST 4583.
