Admission Requirements Prerequisites for the Doctor of Philosophy in Higher Education (HIEDPH) Degree:

Formal admission to the Doctor of **Philosophy (Ph.D.)** Education (Ed.D.) degree in Higher Education requires: Prior admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School, which requires a separate application process; A master's degree or approved equivalent (minimally, 30 hours of post-baccalaureate graduate work completed);

A cumulative grade-point average on all graduate work attempted of at least 3.25;

A satisfactory Millers Analogy Test (MAT) score or Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores; scores (test scores usually at the 50th percentile);

Relevant professional experience in the field of higher education or a closely related field;

A completed Higher Education Program Application for Admission Form;

A current resumé or vitae;

A statement of interest;

At least three references (using our forms);

A writing sample demonstrating the applicant's best writing;

A personal interview with a Higher Education faculty committee, which by majority vote decides admission.

Completed application deadlines are October 15 for Spring admission and March 15 for Fall admission.

Description of specific change Justification for this change 1. Changed the name of the degree from Ed.D. to Ph.D. 1. The program faculty conducted a thorough review of 18 peer research institutions in the region and nationally. All benchmark 2. Increased research requirements from 12 to 15 credit institutions offer a Ph.D. degree in Higher hours Education (or emphasis in higher education) 3. Revised program goals and outcomes, and cleaned up with very similar curriculum and requirements. None of the benchmarks offer only an Ed.D. catalog language degree. Six of the 18 institutions offer both an Ed.D. and a Ph.D. degree, but their Ed.D. programs do not typically require a traditional dissertation and follow an executive education model (for example, require a Capstone or an Action Research project). Ed.D. in Higher Education is also the only Ed.D. degree on this campus that is offered on campus. The rest of

	revealed that the research requirements for Ph.D. in Higher Education equal an average of
	15 credit hours, as opposed to an average of 11 credit hours of research courses for Ed.D.
	programs. The proposed Ph.D. in Higher Education will also require 15 hours of research requirements.
	3. Minor changes in the program goals and outcomes were completed in response to the increase in research requirements and the change in the degree name.
