SCWK 4243 (required) & SCWK 4093. Human Behavior and the Social Environment I (elective) at a cost of \$8,000. (the School of Social Work will coordinate with Global Campus to develop the courses)

Promotion costs for this program are estimated at \$4,000 over 3 years.

The money for this new minor will come from our global campus revenue and from global campus for course development.

Note: All courses for the proposed minor, included the courses to be developed as above for the proposed minor are courses that are offered to our social work major, social work minor and child advocacy study minor. Additionally, most of the courses listed above are offered as electives for most undergraduates on campus.
