Statement of purpose describing academic interests and professional goals and how the Graduate Certificate fits into them.

## Requirements for Graduate Certificate in African and African American Studies

In order to complete the Graduate Certificate in African & African American Studies, students must complete a total of 15 hours of coursework, which must include <u>AAST 5003</u> Graduate Seminar in African & African American Studies.

The remaining 12 hours of coursework must be approved by the Program Director and adhere to the following stipulations:

A maximum of 9 of the 12 may come from courses taken in a single department

At least 9 hours must be from courses numbered 5000 or higher A maximum of 3 hours may be earned through AAST 5913 Independent Study in African and African American Studies OR AAST 5103 Graduate Readings in African & African American Studies

The Graduate Certificate in African & African American Studies is a 15-credit hour program conceived as a rigorous interdisciplinary study of the legacy of the African diaspora and African-descended people's global experiences with a focus on Africa, the United States, and the Caribbean. The certificate's broad-based curriculum and the participation of fifteen different faculty members across the University that will assist graduate students who choose to study the history and culture of the African diaspora. Courses in the program strive to advance social consciousness, inject principles of reason and equality into international debates, and examine the important role that race has played in the creation of the world. Students will therefore gain both the theoretical and analytic skills from a broad array of disciplines in order to advance research on multiple aspects of the African diaspora.
