Admission to the Master's Degree: Admission Students must apply to the Master's Degree

Students must apply to the UA Graduate School before consideration for admission. The M.Ed. in Curriculum and Instruction will use a variety of inputs to determine the qualifications of applicants including; (1) prior undergraduate and graduate work, (2) curriculum vita that includes related experiences, (3) writing sample from prior educational or work setting, (4) statement of purpose that addresses the fit between the applicant's educational needs and the program's learning outcomes; and (5) two letters of recommendation that address the applicant's potential for graduate study. The GRE exam will be required for applicants with an undergraduate G.P.A. below 3.0 unless applicant has already successfully completed a graduate degree. In addition to those requirements, students must provide two letters of recommendation and a personal statement. This statement should discuss their reasons for pursuing the degree as well as a discussion of an area of curricular interest, which will be the focus of their program of study. Students are not required to complete a formal master's thesis but will design will take a class (such as CIED 5013 or CIED 5273) that provides an introduction to education research and then design and carry out an action research project in CIED 5983 Practicum in Curriculum & Instruction. Students Following this two-course sequence, students will defend their project as the comprehensive exam for the degree. This project is will be assessed by a faculty panel which will include the students advisory committee, which includes adviser for the student's primary advisor student's program and two other graduate faculty members. M.Ed. facultymembers. For students who have the experience and desire necessary to complete a formal thesis, this option exists. In such cases, students will form an advisory committee and then propose, write, and defend a thesis project. The successful defense of the thesis will represent the comprehensive exam for the M.Ed. degree.

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Students who choose the thesis option are not required to complete CIED 5013 or CIED 5273 or CIED 5983, but must take six hours of master's thesis credit (CIED 600V) in place of these two courses.

Students should also be aware of Graduate School requirements with regard to master's degrees.
