#### Application Process

**Prerequisites to Degree Program:** An earned bachelor's degree with an art education major or its equivalent. Consideration will be given to applicants without an art major concentration who present evidence of knowledge in art education, art/visual culture, art history, art theory, and/or community art practice. Acceptance to the Master of Arts degree program requires a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution of higher education, with a grade point average of 3.0 on the last 60 credit hours of academic coursework OR a 3.0 cumulative grade point average. GRE scores are accepted, but not required for entrance into the program.

#### **Admission Requirements**

The application is a 2-step process. Each applicant must complete the following steps:

1.
