## Program Requirements and Description

Requirements
The Interdisciplinary Studies Program is targeted toward highly motivated students whose interests, needs, and talents are not reflected or met by existing majors. It is a major in which students will pursue coursework from two or more traditional disciplines in sufficient depth and breadth to prepare them for employment or graduate/professional study. The major will lead to a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies.

There are three options for students who wish to pursue a B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies:
Option 1 - Construction of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of three thematically linked minors, at least one two of which three thematieally linked minors from within the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. One of the three minors may be setected from a program in another college at theuniversity.Students interested Option 1 will follow the specific program requirements as specified by each minor. For for Option 1, Thematically Linked Coursework acourse plan of study must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum number of hours dependent on which group of three minors are selected. selected (in most instances this number would range from $45-57$ hours).

Students selecting Option 1 must consult during their first semester of enrollment with the IDSTBA Program Director to develop their course plan ofstudy.Option 2 - - Construction of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of three to five a thematically linked minors, certificates and microcertificates, at least one set of which from the eoursework primarily setected from, but not limited to, courses in Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. Gollege- Students will follow the specific program requirements as specified by each minor, certificate, and/or microcertificate. Students setecting Option 2 must consult during their first semester of enrollment with the-IDSTBA Program Director to develop an individualized course plan ofstudy.For Option 2,

Thematically Linked Coursework The course plan must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum number of $Z 1$ hours dependent on which minors, certificates or microcertificates are selected. of course work from a single discipline.
Option 3 - Construction of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of a thematically linked set of coursework primarily selected from, but not limited to, courses in Fulbright College. For Option 3,
Thematically Linked Coursework must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum of 21 hours of course work from a single discipline. Thirty credit hours of the proposed coursework must be numbered at the 3000-level 3000 or higher. 4000 level. At At least two-thirds of the advanced level coursework must be completed on the UA-Fayetteville campus.
In addition to the Plan of Study, students wishing to pursue the interdisciplinary studies major must also submit a narrative statement that (1) expresses how the proposed coursework (or group of minors) fit together thematically; (2) expresses why the student's interests and needs are not met by existing degree programs; and (3) expresses how the interdisciplinary studies major contributes to the student's career goals and post-graduate opportunities.

## Interdisciplinary Studies Program Requirements:

A student interested in pursuing a degree in Interdisciplinary Studies must have earned less than 75 credit hours in order to setect the IDSTBAmajor:Students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or better on coursework constituting the major (e.g., Options 1, 2, Option 1 or 3) Option 2) for continuation in the program and in order to graduate with an Interdisciplinary Studies major. Should a student's GPA in the major fall below 2.5, $\mathbf{2 . 5 0}$, he or she will have one semester to bring the GPA back to an acceptable level.
In addition to the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences Graduation Requirements (see under Degree Completion Program Policy.), the following course requirements must be met.
State minimum core requirements may vary by individual, based on placement and previous credit granted. Once all core requirements are met, students may substitute with general electives in consultation with their academic advisor.

1Thematically Linked Coursework approved by the IDST program is considered to meet College Residency and Major Residency requirements.
2Students must present for degree credit at least 40 credit hours of work in courses numbered 3000 and above. Included in these 40 hours can be courses numbered 2000 if each has a specific course designated as
a prerequisite. If Thematically Linked Coursework is not sufficient to satisfy the 40 credit hour rule, general electives must be used as needed to meet this requirement.

Students in Option 2 of the Interdiseiplinary Studies Program are-strongly encouraged to include an Independent Study/Research Project as a component of themajor.Students pursuing an independent study research project may addup to 6 eredit hours of such activity to the 21 -hour maxinum in a singlediscipline. In addition to the coursework defined in the student's Interdisciplinary Studies major, the student must satisfy all college and university requirements related to the state minimum core and advanced-levelcourses.
