### **Program Goals and Objectives**

The goal of the online BSE in Educational Studies for Para-professionals program is to provide working paraprofessionals with an associate's degree a path towards bachelors' degree completion as a necessary requirement to earn their Arkansas teaching license. <u>However, this degree in itself does not lead to licensure.</u> The online BSE is designed to allow working para-professionals around the State of Arkansas a program of study where they need not quit their jobs in public schools or relocated outside of their communities to continue their journey towards becoming fully licensed classroom teachers. The State of Arkansas requires an accredited bachelor's degree for all public pK-12 teachers. No specific bachelor's degree major is required, but a bachelor's degree in the field of education is highly desirable by the State designated providers of alternative (nontraditional college operated) licensure programs. Beyond obtaining future teacher licensure, a completed bachelor's in educational studies will serve as appropriate academic preparation for future graduate studies work in potential fields like school counseling, library/media services, or school social work. <u>This program of studies</u> <u>will complete the necessary requirement of a bachelor's degree to move prospective educators towards the next</u> <u>step of licensure (not provided by the EDST program.)</u>

The online educational studies (EDST) program for para-professionals in the College of Education and Health Professions is designed to develop the knowledge base that will prepare teacher-educators to possess a broad background in education and meeting current schooling needs, particularly in high need geographic locations. The goals of the online EDST program are to:

Provide a high-quality curriculum that prepares students for a multitude of potential careers in education.
Produce teachers-educators who are knowledgeable, skillful, supportive, and professional scholar-

practitioners in diverse educational settings.

3. Produce teachers-educators who are knowledgeable in the fundamentals of educational history, legal requirements, socio-emotional learning, and trauma-informed educational practices.

4. Produce students who are prepared for a multitude of licensure requirement professional assessments.

5. Produce teacher-educators able to demonstrate knowledge of and an appreciation for

diversity, as it relates to a wide range of cultures, ethnicities, religions, non-native English language learners, and socio-economic backgrounds.
