Deadlines to submit the information for the Teaching K-12 Physical Education and Health Program above are May 1 (typically spring sophomore year) for fall admission and Nov. 1 (typically fall junior year) for spring admission.

Appeals must be made to the PHED Program Coordinator for admission after these deadlines.

To enroll in <u>PHED 3003</u> and <u>PHED 3043</u>, students are required to be admitted to the Teaching K-12 Physical Education and Health major.

To enroll in <u>PHED 4703</u>, <u>PHED 4743</u>, and <u>PHED 432V</u>, students are required to have a cumulative grade point average of 2.7 or above and be admitted to the Teaching K-12 Physical Education and Health major.

To be eligible to enroll in the Senior Block Internship semester (<u>PHED 4023</u>, <u>PHED 407V</u>, <u>PHED 4733</u>), students are required to:

Be admitted to the Teaching K-12 Physical Education and Health major.

Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.7.

Take the Praxis II exams required by the Arkansas Department of Education licensure area of K-12 Physical Education, Wellness and Leisure by December 1st.

All students seeking licensure in the state of Arkansas are subject to a criminal background check. Forms for this procedure may be obtained at the office of the Teacher Certification Officer, at the State Department, or any police station, including the campus police. These background checks take up to six months to process; therefore, students are advised to complete and submit the forms to the proper authorities six months in advance of actually applying for a license. Arkansas will not certify anyone who has been convicted of a felony. Although not required for the

Kinesiology concentration in Physical Education, Wellness and Leisure, students seeking coaching endorsement will need to take PHED 4001, take the appropriate standardized exams (ACT, SAT, GRE, or PRAXIS core) as designated by the Arkansas State Department of Education, and make a "C" or better in all courses required by the University of Arkansas for the Coaching Endorsement. Please see the College of Education and Health Professions PDF for these specific course numbers.

Student Dismissal Policy based on Unethical/Unprofessional Behavior

The University of Arkansas' teacher preparation programs adhere to the Code of Ethics of the Education Profession as established by the National Education Association as described in NEA Code of Ethics, Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Code of Ethics, as well as discipline specific codes of ethics and standards found in program handbooks. Violation of these principles may result in probation, suspension, or dismissal of the internship as described:

Any incident of ethical misconduct or concern will be documented by the faculty member(s), discussed directly with the student and their mentor, and referred to the program's coordinator or supervising faculty. It may also be reported to the Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee.

The Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee evaluates the concerns and recommends a course of action, which may range from a zero score on the academic and/or internship work, a failing grade for the course, probation, up to dismissal from a teacher education program.

Any candidate may be suspended by a Teacher Education Program Coordinator for extreme, unforeseen circumstances such as endangerment of students or others, disruption of schools or classes, felonious behaviors, or ethical violations (i.e., Arkansas Code of Ethics, Code of Student Life). Such suspensions will be referred to the Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee for review and may become permanent.

The Program Coordinator, in consultation with the Teacher Education Professional Review Committee and the Dean's Office for Academic and Student Affairs in the College of Education and Health Professions, has the authority and responsibility to dismiss a student from the teacher education program for unethical or unprofessional behavior and/or not recommend the student for licensure. More detailed guidelines about the policies, supports, and other requirements are provided in the program's handbook, as well as on the Office of Teacher Education website or the Teacher Education Support page.

Students who have been dismissed on the basis of unethical or unprofessional conduct may appeal the decision following the procedures outlined under the Student Grievances and Appeals section of the Undergraduate Catalog of Studies.

Description and justification of the request

Description of specific change	Justification for this change

The PPHED was reduced from 17 to 9 credit hours. PBHL 1103 was moved to the PPHED. BIOL 1543, 1541L, 2443, and 2441L were removed as program requirements. The eight hours associated with the BIOL requirements were added to the state minimum core. EXSC 3013/EXSC 3353 were removed. The praxis core requirement was removed from learning outcome one. Learning outcome three, students will earn a C or better in the teacher education courses was removed.

Justification for this change

Due to a reduction in faculty, PHED has had to adjust course offerings, program requirements, and the processes used to matriculate students. The PPHED credit requirement was reduced to ensure the timely acquisition of students to the major. The biology requirements were removed as pre-requisites because the program is not requiring students to take EXSC 3013/3353. The praxis core assessment was removed from learning outcome one because it is no longer a program requirement. Finally, students are no longer required to earn a C in all PHED teacher education courses.
