<u>University</u> The major will lead to a Bachelor of Arkansas and Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences Requirements for a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies: Studies.

<u>The following credit hour requirements</u> In addition to the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences Graduation Requirements (see under Degree Completion Program Policy), the following course requirements <u>must be</u> met (see Degree Completion Program Policy for additional information). met.

State minimum core requirements requirements may vary by individual, based on placement and previous course credit earned. granted. Once all core requirements are met, students may substitute with general electives in consultation with their academic advisor.

Students are required to submit an application to join the Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies and to include a proposed plan of study to the program director.

The Interdisciplinary Studies Program is <u>designed for</u> targeted toward highly motivated students <u>with unique</u> whose interests, needs, and talents <u>that traditional majors do</u> are not <u>fully meet</u>. reflected or met by existing majors. <u>The major can provide a broad range of knowledge and skills that will prepare students for various career paths or further studies at the graduate or professional level. <u>Students completing the major will receive a Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Studies</u>.</u>

Students who wish to pursue a B.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies have three options:

It is a major in which students will pursue coursework from two or more traditional disciplines in sufficient depth and breadth to prepare them for employment or graduate/professionalstudy. The major will lead to a Bachelor of Arts in InterdisciplinaryStudies. There are three options for students who wish to pursue aB.A. in InterdisciplinaryStudies: Option 1 — Construction of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of three thematically linked minors, at least one of which must come from the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. Students will follow the specific program requirements as specified by each minor. For Option 1, the Thematically Linked Coursework must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum number of hours dependent on which group of three minors are selected.

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Option 2 – Construction of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of a thematically linked set of coursework primarily selected from, but not limited to, courses in Fulbright College. For Option 2, Thematically Linked Coursework must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum of 21 hours of course work from a single discipline. Thirty credit hours of the proposed coursework must be numbered at the 30000-level 3000-level or higher. At least two-thirds of the advanced level coursework must be completed on the UA-Fayetteville campus.

Option <u>3 - Construction</u> <u>3 - Construction</u> of an Interdisciplinary Studies major consisting of three to five thematically linked minors, <u>certificates</u>, <u>certificates</u> and microcertificates, at least one of which <u>must come</u> from the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. Students will follow the specific program requirements as specified by each minor, certificate, and/or microcertificate. For Option 3, <u>the</u> Thematically Linked Coursework must contain a minimum of 45 credit hours with a maximum number of hours dependent on which minors, <u>certificates</u>, <u>certificates</u> or microcertificates are selected.

In addition to the Plan of Study, students wishing to pursue the interdisciplinary studies major must also submit a narrative statement that (1) expresses how the proposed coursework (or group of minors) fit together thematically; (2) expresses why the student's interests and needs are not met by existing degree programs; and (3) expresses how the interdisciplinary studies major contributes to the student's career goals and post-graduateopportunities. 
IDST 20003 should be taken as early as possible, ideally in the first semester in the major.

Students must present for degree credit at least 40 credit hours of work in courses numbered 30000 and above. Included in these 40 hours can be courses numbered 20000 if each has a specific course designated as a

prerequisite. Additionally, students must complete 30 credit hours of work from the University of Arkansas Fayetteville. If Thematically Linked Coursework is not sufficient to satisfy the 40 credit hour and 30 credit hour rules, general electives must be used as needed to meet these requirements.

Students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 or better on coursework constituting the major (e.g., Options 1, 2, or 3) for continuation in the program and in order to graduate with an Interdisciplinary Studiesmajor. Should a student's GPA in the major fall below 2.5, he or she will have one semester to bring the GPA back to an acceptablelevel. In addition to the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences Graduation Requirements (see under Degree Completion Program Policy), the following course requirements must be met. State minimum core requirements may vary by individual, based on placement and previous creditgranted. Once all core requirements are met, students may substitute with general electives in consultation with their academicadvisor.



Interdisciplinary Studies B.A. Eight-Semester Degree Plan

Students enrolling in the eight-semester degree plan should review the <u>Eight-Semester Degree Completion Policy</u>. State minimum core requirements may vary by individual, based on placement and previous credit granted. Once all core requirements are met, students may substitute with general electives in consultation with their academic advisor.
