Stage II: Admission to the B.A.T. Program

Program

Admission to the Bachelor of Arts in Teaching program (B.A.T.) occurs the semester after the candidate has completed all pre-B.A.T. requirements, including the first three courses in education — CIED 10003, CIED 10103, and CIED 30803 — Prior to a student entering one of the individual programs of study the following fall term. The B.A.T. program is competitive, and meeting the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the program. Applications to the B.A.T. program must be submitted by January 31 deadlines stated on the Office of the application year. Teacher Educationwebsite. The application process includes:

Students must complete the application to teacher education through education (see the Teacher Education Application Fee) through the Teacher Education Office during the time period stated on the Razorback Educator Development Hub (RED Hub) website. the Office of Teacher Education website. This includes completing completion and passing the criminal background check.*

Submission of B.A.T. application.

Submission of writing sample to content area faculty.

Submission of transcripts for all coursework.

Another background check will be required prior to graduation in order to be eligible for licensure.

Stage III: Requirements for Program Continuation and <u>Admission to Fall Residency (senior year)</u> Internship Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better.

All professional education courses <u>must have a grade of 'B' or better</u> and <u>required</u> content courses <u>must have a grade of must have a grade of 'C' or better</u>. or better (except SEED 32803 below). No teaching methods courses may be taken as self-paced (correspondence) courses.

Stage IV: Requirements for Admission to Advanced Residency Internship Semester (spring, senior year). year) and Program CompletionAll students in the B.A.T.

All students in the B.A.T. program must complete the following requirements prior to being admitted to the SEED 42906 (Spring Semester): spring semester of their senior year.

<u>Earn a grade of 'B' or better for all professional education courses and a grade of 'C' or better for all required</u> content courses.

Students must earn a 'B' or better in the fall semester, senior year SEED 32803 practicumcourse. Earn a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better by the end of the fall semester, senior year. Students are not permitted enter to intern in the SEED 42906 in spring if the spring if the GPA requirement has not been met.

Complete Students must have taken the appropriate Praxis II-Content Knowledge exam. exam to be admitted to the spring semester, senior year. Students are not permitted enter the SEED 42906 in the spring if they have not taken the appropriate Praxis II exam. Admission is not contingent on earning a particular cut score.

<u>Maintain full admission to the Teacher Education Program via the University of Arkansas Teacher Support System.</u>

Maintain a minimum average score of 1.0 (Developing) as calculated for each of the 8 domains of the Educator Dispositions Assessment submitted by:

Program faculty in SEED 30803, SEED 40603, SEED 32903, SEED 40203, and Content Area Methods 1 University Supervisor(s) and Mentor Teacher(s) in SEED 32803 (Fall Residency)

Candidate must complete a successful internship admission interview with B.A.T. faculty. Note these interviews are scheduled with all senior students during the fallsemester. Satisfactorily complete the Fall Residency internship/student teaching experience that has been approved by the Director of Field Placement.

All students seeking licensure in the state of Arkansas are subject to a criminal background check. Background checks can take up to six months to process; therefore, students are advised to complete and submit the forms to the proper authorities at least six months in advance of graduation (or six months prior to applying for a teaching license). Arkansas will not grant a teaching license to anyone who has been convicted of a felony.

Dismissal based on Unethical or Unprofessional Behaviors from the B.A.T. program

The University of Arkansas' teacher preparation programs adhere to the Code of Ethics of the Education

Profession as established by the National Education Association as described in NEA Code of Ethics, Arkansas

Division of Elementary and Secondary Education Code of Ethics, as well as discipline specific codes of ethics and standards found in program handbooks. Violation of these principles may result in probation, suspension, or dismissal of the internship as described:

Any incident of ethical misconduct or concern will be documented by the faculty member(s), discussed directly with the student and their mentor, and referred to the program's coordinator or supervising faculty. It may also be reported to the Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee.

The Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee evaluates the concerns and recommends a course of action, which may range from a zero score on the academic and/or internship work, a failing grade for the course, probation, up to dismissal from a teacher education program.

Any candidate may be suspended by a Teacher Education Program Coordinator for extreme, unforeseen circumstances such as endangerment of students or others, disruption of schools or classes, felonious behaviors, or ethical violations (i.e. Arkansas Code of Ethics, Code of Student Life). Such suspensions will be referred to the Teacher Candidate Professional Review Committee for review and may become permanent.

The Program Coordinator, in consultation with the Teacher Education Professional Review Committee and the Dean's Office for Academic and Student Affairs in the College of Education and Health Professions, has the authority and responsibility to dismiss a student from the teacher education program for unethical or unprofessional behavior and/or not recommend the student for licensure.

More detailed guidelines about the policies, supports, and other requirements are provided in the program's handbook, as well as on the Razorback Educator Development Hub (RED Hub) or the Teacher Education Support page. Students who have been dismissed on the basis of unethical or unprofessional conduct may appeal the decision following the procedures outlined under the Student Grievances and Appeals section of the Undergraduate Catalog of Studies.
