DIRECT ASSESSMENT METHODS:

- All theatre majors must take an upper level theatre history course containing a writing-intensive component that also serves the "Senior Writing Requirement."
- All theatre majors participate in a capstone event, Senior Progress Review, where they must complete a series of assignments in order to demonstrate their academic skills. Students are asked to complete the following:
- · A portfolio of work in a focused area of study of their choosing.
- A professional resume and headshot.
- An essay outlining their participation in departmental activities, courses, and productions.
- Participation in a follow-up interview with a faculty mentor. The faculty members within the student's focused area of study evaluate each student's presentation.

INDIRECT ASSESSMENT METHODS:

- Course grades and average GPA of theatre majors.
- · Honors, awards, and scholarships earned by students and alumni.
- Student acceptance into MFA programs in design, acting, directing, and playwriting.
- Student participation in regional and national auditions and portfolio presentations.
- Student's hired at summer stocks, regional theatres, professional theatres, and other allied performance and/or design and technology companies.

TIMELINES FOR DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS:

- Upon completion of the Senior Progress Review, all participating senior theatre majors will submit their completed portfolio of documents to the Faculty Curriculum Committee.
- The SPR is administered during the final week of the fall semester.
- The Faculty Curriculum Committee (FCC) will collect and analyze the data and document key findings and trends.

USE OF RESULTS:

- The FCC will write a report of the findings and share them with the chair and vice chair.
- Results will be communicated to the rest of the faculty at the first faculty meeting of the spring semester.
- The chair and the FCC will recommend any curricular adjustments if the responses show that students are not prepared adequately to matriculate to the next level of theatre production.
