Requirements

Pre-Licensure B.S.N. Program (P-NURS/Health)

Admission Policies

Admission to the Pre-Licensure B.S.N. Program

Students interested in the traditional, on campus pre-licensure BSN program must be admitted to the University of Arkansas as pre-nursing (P-NURS/Health) majors. Admission to the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing requires a separate application in addition to the application to the University of Arkansas. In line with initiatives of the university and the College of Education and Health Professions, as well as the philosophy of the Eleanor Mann

School of Nursing, a holistic admission process is utilized to enhance a diverse academic experience for all students and results in additional expertise in providing care to an increasingly diverse patient population. Admission will be determined by the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing's faculty. To be eligible to apply, students must be admitted to the University of Arkansas, be a pre-nursing/health major, submit a complete application package on or before the deadline, have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or more, score a 70 or higher on the ATI TEAS entrance exam, complete the Casper Situational Judgment Test, and have completed a background check. Background checks are governed by <u>AR Code § 17-87-312 (2020)</u> (or any future version). An individual is not eligible to receive or hold a license issued by a licensing entity if that individual has pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to or been found guilty of any of the offenses outlined in <u>AR Code § 17-3-102 (2020)</u> (or any future version), thus they will not be eligible to apply for the nursing major(s).

Students are permitted to apply to the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing a maximum of two times, or two separate

admission cycles. EMSON faculty will not consider late or incomplete application packages.

The holistic admission process for the pre-licensure BSN program is as follows:

A complete application to the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing is submitted. Please refer to current dates and detailed application instructions on the admissions website: <u>https://nursing.uark.edu/bsn/admission-</u> requirements.php.

Students transferring from another nursing program must provide a letter from the nursing program indicating that they are eligible to return and are in good standing as part of their admission application.

Final transcripts will need to be submitted for any non-University of Arkansas coursework by the end of the open application cycle. Official application cycles and important deadlines may be found on the application website <u>https://nursing.uark.edu/bsn/admission-requirements.php</u>.

Upon review of all required documents, nursing school faculty will review the following:

Primary Academic Factors

Cumulative pre-requisite GPA calculated from all pre-requisite scores, including those officially transferred from another institution within the last 10 years.

Pre-requisite courses included in the GPA calculation (if completed by the end of the semester in which the student is submitting their application):

To apply, students must complete at least 29 hours of the 4 required pre-requisite courses (as listed above) by the end of the semester in which they are submitting their application, including at least 3 of the 4 required science courses with lab (<u>CHEM 12103</u>/<u>CHEM 12101 (or higher)</u>, <u>CHEM 12101</u>, <u>BIOL 24003</u>/<u>BIOL 24001</u>, <u>BIOL 24103</u>/<u>BIOL 24101</u>, <u>BIOL 24003</u>/<u>BIOL 20003</u>/<u>BIOL 20001</u>).

Courses in which the student is enrolled at the time of application will be calculated in the cumulative GPA once final semester grades are released.

CASPer© Situational Judgment Test Score

<u>Students need to have a current test score per application cycle. The timing of the test depends on when students</u> <u>apply. Most students will take the test in the semester immediately preceding the application deadline.</u>

Successful completion of required nursing prerequisite courses as listed in the table below. Students may have one required science course with lab incomplete at the time of admission, but students must be enrolled in the final required science course during the semester in which admission notifications occur to be eligible for admission. Required Science courses with labs include <u>CHEM 12103/CHEM 12101 (or higher)</u>, <u>CHEM 12101</u>, BIOL 24003/BIOL 24001, BIOL 24103/BIOL 24101, and BIOL 20003/BIOL 20001.

For students entering the University of Arkansas as freshmen, credits transferred in from high school dual enrollment or AP/IB credit will be counted in the required nursing prerequisite courses at the UA.

Technical Standards

Students must be aware of Technical Program Standards as listed in the Student Handbook. If students have questions or concerns about their ability to meet the technical standards or if they need to arrange reasonable accommodations, they should contact the Center for Educational Access prior to the start of the semester and ensure they request any accommodations needed for both didactic and clinical courses. If accommodations are not secured prior to the start of the semester for clinical courses, students may experience delays in clinical placement and course progression.
