The change would involve broadening the base of courses that could be taken to satisfy the Journalism requirements for the combined major.

JOPLBA - Attachment D8
At present, the Journalism program includes the "combined major" option: Journalism/Political Science. In the combined major program, students take a selection of the Journalism and Political Science courses required for the full major in any of the areas. For example, the Journalism/ Political Science combined major requires 24 hours of Journalism and 24 hours of Political Science. The change would involve broadening the base of courses that could be taken to satisfy the Journalism requirements for the combined major.
MUSMED - Attachment D9
Delete MUSMED as a program code. This does not involve the elimination of any degree program, but merely a program code that was created for advising/degree audit purposes. The degree program still exists in the form of MUSCBM and an appropriate secondary music education/emphasis concentration code.
MUED - Attachment D10
Delete MUED as a program concentration code. This does not involve the elimination of any concentration, but merely a code that should have been eliminated in spring 2002 when new combined emphasis/secondary music education codes were created for better advising/degree audit purposes.

LGST-M - Attachment D11
The course BLAW 2013 (Legal Environment of Business) will be deleted from the menu of elective courses and the course FDSC 3202 (Introduction to Food Law) will be added.
PADMBS - Attachment D12

## 5. PROGRAM SUMMARY:

A Minor in Japanese with a Business Orientation consists of fifteen hours of coursework in advanced Japanese language courses, upper-level Japanese courses for business purposes, and upper-level courses in Japanese society and culture. Students must complete the fifteen hours with a minimum grade of "C" in each course.

Because these courses are currently being offered by existing faculty members, there is no need for any additional program costs, faculty or library resources, or facilities and equipment.

## 6. NEED FOR THE PROGRAM

Japanese language skills will greatly expand University of Arkansas students' future employability at U.S. offices of Japanese corporations and U.S. corporations with substantial business activities with their Japanese partners. This employability will increase further if the degree they receive from the program is directed specifically to address the needs of their future employers. Today, a growing number of Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries find Arkansas an attractive U.S. state for investment, as evidenced by Wal-Mart's business partnership with Seiyu (a Japanese supermarket franchise), the October 2003 announcement by Eakas Corporation (a U.S. affiliate of Sakae Riken Kogyo Co. Ltd. in Japan) to build a new auto parts manufacturing factory in the City of Wynne, AR, and the July 2004 announcement by Hino Motors, Ltd. (a major Japanese truck maker), to build a new truck parts plant near the City of Marion. Additionally, state government officials predict that more investments by Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries are forthcoming.

A substantial enrollment increase in the Japanese program (from 65 in Fall 2000 to more than 170 in Fall 2004) strongly indicates the students' interest in the program. Furthermore, enrollment in upper-level Japanese has increased to a considerable degree as a result of rescheduling at the time that is more accessible to the students, particularly student athletes and students who previously had scheduling conflicts with their core major requirements.

This program will contribute to the State of Arkansas by enabling the home-grown students to demonstrate to prospective employers a combination of advanced Japanese language skills, skills for the Japanese language for business purposes, and courses designed to facilitate the students' understanding of Japanese society and culture. Also, a solid and sustainable enrollment of students with such skills at a state university would help attract investment by Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries in Arkansas.

This proposed Minor program would make students at the University of Arkansas Japanese program highly competitive in employment at Japanese corporations and their subsidiaries in the U.S. because it specifically addresses the needs of prospective employers in ways that many comparable programs at other institutions do not. Whereas the Minor programs at many other institutions are mostly designed for the Japanese language for general purposes, the proposed Minor program is designed for the Japanese language for purposes that are in demand at international corporations. A number of U.S. institutions offer minor, major, or graduate degrees in Japanese, although few of these programs are oriented to Japanese for business purposes. In Arkansas, there is currently no state university offering a degree program in Japanese. In surrounding states, many SEC universities and institutions in Georgia, Oklahoma and Texas offer a minor in Japanese, although most of them are not oriented to any specific purpose. These universities include: Georgia Tech University, Oklahoma State University, University of Alabama at Tuscaloosa, University of Kentucky, University of Oklahoma, University of Tennessee at Knoxville, and University of Texas at Austin.

Mullins Library at the University of Arkansas presently holds approximately 3,500 books on Japanese language, culture and society. Many of them directly deal with the Japanese language, Japanese culture and society, whereas numerous Japanese literary works are available in English translation. Additionally, numerous academic journals presently available at the library include articles on Japanese linguistics, culture, society, literature, and other fields. Students and faculty are also able to obtain a variety of relevant academic journal articles and other publications through the Interlibrary Loan service provided by Mullins Library.

The Japanese Program uses classrooms mostly at Kimpel Hall and Walton College building. As an integral part of its academic activities, the Japanese Program uses computer and audiovisual facilities at the Language Learning Center (located at 201 Kimpel Hall). Additionally, the Japanese Program makes active use of audio files on WebCT, which the students can access on the Internet.

Under the proposed plan, the Japanese Program would continue to offer three sections of Elementary Japanese I/II (JAPN 1003/1013) courses in Fall and Spring Semesters, respectively. The two Teaching Assistants would teach two classes each per semester while the full-time professor would teach three classes per semester plus one course in Summer Session. Special Studies (JAPN 3983) is also available to students in Spring Semester upon individual request. The two Teaching Assistants are currently hired by the Department of Foreign Languages. Therefore, there are no new costs associated with this program, as currently available courses will be offered for the Minor.

All necessary funds for the teaching faculty (one tenure-track faculty and two teaching assistants) are currently provided by the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences. Also, funds for facilities described in "9. DESCRIPTION OF RESOURCES" are currently provided.

The University of Texas at Austin currently offers a minor in Japanese. This program is not aimed at the language for any specific purpose, although it complements the university's Asian Studies program.

Oklahoma State University offers a minor in Japanese. This program is not aimed at the language for any specific purpose. This degree requires the successful completion of at least 20 hours of courses (including two elementary Japanese courses) with a minimum grade of "C" for each upper-division course.

The University of Oklahoma offers a minor in Japanese. This program is not aimed at the language for any specific purpose. This degree requires the successful completion of at least 25 hours of courses (including two elementary Japanese courses) with the minimum 9 hours at the upper-division level.

The University of Kentucky offers a Minor in Japan Studies oriented to cultural studies. This degree requires basic Japanese language courses, Japanese Cultural Studies, and elective courses on contemporary East Asian History, Politics, and Society.

The University of Alabama at Tuscaloosa offers a minor in Japanese. This degree requires the minimum 20 credit hours of upper-level Japanese courses including Commercial Japanese I/II, Fourth Year Japanese (Reading and Writing, Spoken), Japanese Literature in Translation (traditional and contemporary), Seminar in Japanese Literature, and transfer credit from a study-in-Japan program.

The University of Tennessee at Knoxville offers a minor in Japanese. This degree requires 18 hours of Japanese courses, including Advanced Japanese and other upperlevel reading courses.

Georgia Tech University offers a minor in Japanese. Students must earn 18 credit hours of upper-level elective courses in Japanese. These courses consist of Advanced Japanese I/II, Technical Japanese I/II, Technical and Scientific Japanese, Business Japanese, Japan Today (course in current trends in Japanese society), and Special Topics in Japanese.

## 16. DESEGREGATION

The Japanese Program has been successful in recruiting among the best of African American students, including leading members of various student organizations and a current participant in a long-term study-in-Japan program. The Japanese Program fully intends to continue reaching out to African American and other minority students by making effective use of information on the Japanese Program Web site and other promotional materials.

Given the current popularity among major Japanese corporations of Arkansas as a venue for their factories and business partnerships, we strongly believe that the proposed program will attract a number of minority students in need of the skills that would significantly increase their employment opportunities.

Students pursuing teaching certification in music education enroll as Bachelor of Music majors with a concentration in music education in one of the following emphasis areas: wind/percussion, strings, choral/voice, or choral/piano. This, as a matter of practice, has not changed in a very long time. What has changed has been the method of tracking and coding for degree audit purposes. Several years ago, the degree audit process did not work very well for the music education students, because it required that they major in MUSCBM and then have two concentration codes: one for MUED and one for the emphasis area. This did not seem to work very well for the degree audits.

At a later time, a program code of MUSMED was used to identify Bachelor of Music majors interested in music education so that only one concentration code would be required for the area of emphasis. In Spring 2002, the music department "cleaned up" the concentration codes so that there would be a unique concentration code for each emphasis area in the BM degree, hence a unique concentration code for each emphasis within Music Education. Those students interested in music education have been advised and are being placed in MUSCBM with one of these concentration codes. There is no longer a need for MUSMED as a program code, since it was merely a way to classify those bachelor of music students who were interested in music education to assist with advising/degree audit processes. The new concentration codes created in spring ' 02 better serve this purpose.

Students pursuing teaching certification in music education enroll as Bachelor of Music majors with a concentration in music education in one of the following emphasis areas: wind/percussion, strings, choral/voice, or choral/piano. This, as a matter of practice, has not changed in a very long time. What has changed has been the method of tracking and coding for degree audit purposes. Several years ago, the degree audit process did not work very well for the music education students, because it required that they maior in MUSCBM and then have two concentration codes: one for MUED and one for the emphasis area. This did not seem to work very well for the degree audits.

In Spring 2002, the music department "cleaned up" the concentration codes so that there would be a unique concentration code for each emphasis area in the BM degree, hence a unique concentration code each emphasis within Music Education. Those students interested in music education have been advised and are being placed in MUSCBM with one of these concentration codes. There is no longer a need for MUED as a concentration code, since it was merely a way to classify those bachelor of music students who were interested in music education to assist with advising/degree audit processes. New codes were created in spring ' 02 that better serve this purpose.
