Justify this change and state its likely effect on any other degree program (including those outside the school or college). Identify any program or program components (other than courses) to be eliminated if this program is implemented. (Program and course change forms must also be submitted for such related changes.)

The elimination of the BA in Geology is requested for three reasons: 1) low enrollment; 2) inadequacy of the curriculum in mathematics and physics for majors choosing careers as professional geologists or graduate programs in geology; and 3) duplication of content, and goals with the existing BS in Earth Sciences for students interested in pursuing non-professional geology careers, i.e. secondary school teaching. Currently, only three students are enrolled in the program. Two are juniors and one is a freshman. On average, one student per year graduates with this degree. These students do not have the requisite courses in mathematics (i.e. calculus) and physics to succeed as professional geologists. Elimination of the BA in Geology will not adversely impact students. They will still be able to choose either the BS in Geology, which is the degree comparable to that offered by other geology programs nationwide and is the professional preparation, or the BS in Earth Sciences, which is the degree of choice for those planning to become K-12 educators or for those wanting a generalized background in Earth Sciences.
