2. State Minimum Core requirements with regard to Science are changed. The previous requirement was the completion of CHEM1074/1071L and CHEM2613/2611L and BIOL1543/1541L. The new requirement will be the successful completion of CHEM1074/1071L or CHEM1103/1101L. Also, students will be required to successfully complete an additional science course with a lab (totaling 4 hours) from the State Minimum Core.
3. State Minimum Core requirements with regard to Fine Arts and Humanities are changed so that students are not required to complete ARTS1003. The new requirement is for students to choose 6 hours from courses that meet the Fine Arts and Humanities requirements of the State Minimum Core.
4. HESC3203 Nutrition/Health Prof & Educ will no longer be included in the course requirements.
5. The following courses will be new requirements:
 - a. HESC2402/2401L Infant & Toddler Development and Lab
 - b. HESC3423 Adolescent Development
 - c. HESC3443 Families in Crisis
 - d. HESC4433 Dynamic Family Interaction
 - e. A choice of HESC2123 Catering Management (Prereq: HESC1603) or HESC2203 Nutrition for Exercise Sport. Previously, students were limited to only completing HESC2123.
 - f. A choice of HESC4813 Human Factors in ID (Prereq: Permission) or CATE4803 Problems in CATE (Housing) Previously, students were limited to only completing HESC4813
 - g. Note that these changes represent an increase in HESC courses from 43 hrs to 55 hrs.

The general human environmental sciences curriculum serves students seeking a background in all of the subject-matter areas of human environmental sciences. The general curriculum prepares students for careers in social services, business, and the Cooperative Extension Service. Liberal elective hours allow students to select courses and programs to meet individual needs.

Students may be certified by the Arkansas State Board of Education to teach family and consumer sciences in Arkansas public schools by combining the pre-professional education courses as electives and completing the Master of Arts in teaching (M.A.T.) degree requirements. (See M.A.T., page 240). At the beginning of the sophomore year, students should consult with their advisers to schedule the general education and pre-professional education courses.
