1. We propose to delete the restriction imposed by the "Eight Hour Rule." With the changes to the core curriculum and departmental requirements previously passed by the college faculty, we propose eliminating the "Eight Hour Rule." First, the Eight Hour Rule has not been reviewed in many years and generally reflects a dated understanding of many disciplines and academic areas. In many cases, the academic areas listed under the rule have substantially changed and to limit our student's access is often arbitrary and unnecessary. Second, it is possible that one or more of these areas might be complementary to the student's major in Fulbright College. Third, the application of a matrix of "rules" has become a guiding strategy in how we framed our curriculum. While not all restrictions that are "hour-rules" based are capricious, we believe there are better curriculum options. Fourth, the restrictions on AERO and MILS are especially capricious and unwarranted. Finally, and to that end, we propose to eliminate the Eight Hour Rule as a first step so that departmental faculty will have the option of modifying their major's degree requirements to reflect an alternative (not so heavily "rules-based") orientation. For instance, a degree program might require students to complete a minor in a related area, increase the number of advanced hours in the major, choose hours from a list of advanced electives, etc.

2. The proposed change eliminates the exclusion of MILS and AERO. While we ultimately will recommend departments restructure their curriculums to deemphasize "rules-based" hour limitations, this change removes unnecessary restrictions. SECTION VII: Catalog Text and Format

## Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences Graduation Requirements

In addition to the specific course requirements for the degree plan and major, be aware that there are general graduation requirements that every student in Fulbright College must complete.

## 1. Minimum Total Semester Hour Requirement

B.A., B.M., B.S. and B.S.W. Degrees: 124 hours

B.F.A.: 128 hours

#### 2. Residency Requirements

a) University Residency (Enrollment) Requirement

Students must earn a minimum of 30 semester hours at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville campus—this includes UA faculty-led study abroad classes, on-line/on-campus classes, and Global Campus courses; and all other courses paid towards Fayetteville campus tuition and fees. These 30 semester hours are to be upper-division semester hours required for the completion of a degree program. Additional hours in residence can be required for completing a minor. Hours earned in another school or college at UA, Fayetteville may be used to satisfy this requirement with approval of appropriate faculty curriculum committee.

b) College Residency Requirement and 24 Hour Rule

A student graduating from Fulbright College must have completed at least 30 hours of credit in courses offered by Fulbright College, at least 24 of which must be 3000 and 4000 level courses from departments in Fulbright College.

#### 3. 40-Hour Rule

Students must present for degree credit at least 40 hours of work in courses numbered 3000 and above. Included in these 40 hours can be courses numbered 2000 if each has a specific course designated as a prerequisite. (The following courses are excluded: MILS 2001 and 2011, and AERO 2001 and 2011.) It is highly recommended that students complete all 40 hours in courses numbered 3000 and higher. These courses may be taken from other colleges or universities as long as the college residency requirement and the 24-hour rule are satisfied.

## 4. Grade-Point Average

Students graduating from Fulbright College must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00.

5. "D"- Rule

If a student has grades of "D" in more than 25 percent of the hours presented for graduation credit, she/he will not be allowed to graduate.

6. 68-Hour Rule

Students who transfer into the University may present for degree credit no more than 68 hours of lower division course work (1000 and 2000 level).

87. Writing Requirement

Students graduating from Fulbright College must write a research/analytical paper for at least one upper-division course in his or her major. Each department has determined its own procedures for certifying completion of this requirement. Questions should be referred to the departmental chairperson.

A student may choose to write a senior thesis in a major area of study. The thesis may be accorded up to six hours of credit. Defense of the thesis before a committee is required.

Satisfactory completion of an honors project or a senior thesis may be submitted to meet the college writing requirement.

8. Students must complete the stated requirements for a Fulbright College major in addition to all University Requirements for Graduation, including the University Core Requirements (see page 40).

Questions concerning fulfilling the requirements should be referred to the student's adviser or to the dean's office, which will maintain current lists of approved courses, experimental offerings approved to fulfill requirements for a specified period of time, examination schedules, and other options available to the student.
