And a minimum of 31-37 semester hours to include CMJS 2003, CMJS 2023, CMJS 2023, CMJS/SOCI 3023, SOCI/CMJS 3043, CMJS/SOCI 3203, SOCI 3201, SOCI 3303, SOCI 3313, and 12 hours of 3000- and 4000-level criminal justice or sociology courses not taken above. one course from CMJS 3003, CMJS 3503. Nine hours to complete the 31-semester-hour requirement from 3000- and 4000-level criminal justice or sociology courses not taken above.

For transfer students, a minimum of 18 hours or coursework in the major at the University of Arkansas is required.
