Students in colleges other than the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences would be allowed to add a major in German by completing 24 hours in German: GERM 3003, 3013, 3033, 4003, 4213 and 9 hours of upper-level electives.

There are no curriculum additions or modifications required, as these courses already currently exist. There are no additional costs in terms of program management, faculty resources, library resources, or facilities and equipment; there is enough room to accommodate students in existing classes. In fact, many students from other colleges take these courses now in order to earn minors in German; some take the full 24 hours but are not able to earn the major (as it is housed in a different college). This proposed major would allow students of other colleges officially to certify to employers and professional schools that they have added a significant field of study to their degrees by majoring in German rather than having merely listing additional courses on their transcript.

#### **Background for program need**

Until recently, students in colleges other than Fulbright College were prohibited from adding a language major due to the core of Fulbright College being significantly larger than those of the other colleges. Students in the College of Engineering and the Sam M. Walton College of Business frequently approached faculty about the possibility of earning a second major in language, but almost all were dissuaded by the fact that adding the courses for a major would have also required in addition the completion of 31 hours above those required in the other colleges by the state core. While this problem has been somewhat ameliorated by the new core system in Fulbright College, the new WLLC core for language majors adds 15 hours (an additional semester's worth of study) to the state 35 hour minimum core. The major proposed in this document would allow students in other colleges to add courses in language instruction with a goal towards fluency without requiring them to complete the courses that are deemed necessary for liberal arts students focusing solely on language and literature. The 24 hours are those that traditionally composed the German major: GERM 3003, 3013, 3033, 4003, 4213 and 9 hours of upper-level electives.

Precedents for this policy exist in two circumstances. First, current policy in Fulbright College allows those receiving a B.S., B.M., or B.F.A. degree to add a major in language without completing the core for the B.A. degree. Second, students of Japanese may complete a minor program in Japanese with Business Orientation, which is a field of study directed towards students in one particular college.

The existing German Bachelor Degree supports the proposed program.
