#### Concentration

• The Ph.D. Program in Business Administration with a Supply Chain Management Concentration allows students to concentrate within one of two areas: logistics or global supply chain management. The student's concentration will determine

the courses taken in fulfilling the supporting fields requirement and the specialization for the comprehensive examination.

#### **Program Requirements**

• Generally, the program is composed of 60 credit hours. Up to 6 credit hours of prior coursework may be applied to the requirements for the supply chain management Concentration with the recommendation and consent of the student's Ph.D. Program Advisory Committee.

## **Supporting Fields (12 hours)**

• Courses for the supporting fields requirement are made in consultation with the student's Ph.D. Program Advisory Committee. #### **Dissertation (18 hours)**

• A dissertation will be written under the guidance of the supply chain management faculty. The dissertation committee consists of a minimum of 3 graduate faculty members. One graduate faculty member outside the Department may be chosen for this committee depending on the dissertation topic.
