Department of Agricultural and Extension Education

ACETBS - BSA, Agricultural and Extension Education – Attachment 1A

Proposal requests to drop AGME 4011 - Content for this course is integrated into Program Development course, and drop Special Topics, AGME 402V, as a course listed on the check sheet. Add AGED 2143 as a requirement for Agricultural Communications (ACOM) concentration - This is a new program introductory course designed to fill a void. Add AGED 4543 as a concentration elective for ACOM - This is a new course. Change CHEM 1074 to 1073 and change Electives total hours. See Section V of Attachment 1A for more information.

ACOM-M – Agricultural Communications Minor – Attachment 1B

CHEM 1074 has been changed to CHEM 1073. Since CHEM 1074 was a required course in our program, this change is necessary to correspond to the change of CHEM 1074 to CHEM 1073. The hours in the Physical and Biological Sciences area will change from 17 to 16. The one hour reduction in Physical and Biological Sciences will become available as general electives, so hours in General Electives will change from 23-29 to 24 to 30. With the creation of the new Department of Supply Chain Management, the faculty is prepared to formalize the Supply Chain Concentration.
