## **Bumpers College of Agriculture, Food and Life Sciences**

#### School of Human Environmental Sciences

HESCBS – BSHES, Bachelor of Science in Human Environmental Sciences, General Human Environmental Science Concentration – Attachments 1A, 1A-1, 1A-2, 1A-3, 1A-4, 1A-5 and 1A-6

The changes specified for this program change allow faculty to teach courses more effectively and efficiently while keeping with the university's idea of teaching, research and service. Deletion of HESC 4813 was due to the interior design program leaving the School of Human Environmental Sciences. Addition of HESC 1603 allows students exposure to the hospitality industry. Changes to HLSC courses are reflected in that the program changed its name to CHLP. Use of CATE 4803 will eliminate the need for course substitutions for HESC 4813 (See Attachment 1A-1 for College of Education and Health Professions approval). The total hours for the degree are being reduced to 120 hours in order to comply with ACT 747.
