1. The overall reduction in hours from 124 to 120 is needed to comply with state-wide mandate, Act 747.

Studio Art:
2. The phrase "beyond courses applied to the state minimum core" is needed to clarify that the $\mathbf{1 5}$ hours of coursework outside of the department should be above and beyond any courses taken to satisfy the state core (double-dipping not allowed). 3. Streamlined the list of art history requirements-no programmatic changes here other than adding in new courses that have been created over the last couple of years to provide students with additional options.
4. Re-ordered some of the coursework in the 8 -semester plan to provide better preparation and transition for students who might seek to pursue the BFA degree, and to also provide some flexibility within the department for advising and enrollment management of ART studio classes.
5. Provide clarity to the students regarding the sequencing of the primary and secondary studio courses.
6. 4 credit hours of general electives have been removed from the 8 -semester plan to bring the overall number of credits to 120 .

## Art History:

7. ARHS 4933 has been added as an option that can be used to satisfy the 2nd group ARHS course requirement--new course will provide students with broader options.
8. Because the required Intermediate I 2003-level world language course may also satisfy a University/state core humanities requirement, the 8 -semester plan needs to be corrected so that students do not unnecessarily take an additional lower-level humanities course.
9. Some re-sequencing of ARTS coursework is being done to provide the department with advising flexibility and enrollment management in required coursework.
10. References in Fall Semester Year 4 and Spring Semester Yr 4 to Group 1 or 2 are being removed due to programmatic changes that were approved last year, but were not properly reflected in the 8 -semester plan.
11. 4 credit hours of general electives have been removed from the 8 -semester plan to bring the overall number of credits down to 120 .

A minimum of 58 semester hours, including 15 hours of courses; taken outside the department of art (beyond courses applied to the state minimum core and as approved by a departmental adviser); and 43 hours to include ARTS 1013, ARTS 1313, ARTS 1323, ARTS 2013, ARTS 2313, ARTS 4921, and at least 12 hours in art history to include: ARHS 2913 (Survey I) and 2923 (Survey II); one course from ARHS 4833 (Ancient), ARHS 4843(Medieval), ARHS 4853 (Italian Renaissance), ARHS 4863 (Northern Renaissance), ARHS 4873, or ARHS 4983 (Baroque); and one course from ARHS 4813, ARHS 4823, ARHS 4883-(18th and 19th Century European Art), ARHS 4893(20th Century European), ARHS 4913(American Art to 1860), ARHS 4923, (American Art 1860-1960), ARHS 4933 or ARHS 4993. ARHS 4813 (History of Photography), ARHS 4823 (History of Graphic Design). In addition to the freshman year block of courses, the art major must complete a minimum of three semesters ( 9 credits) in one specialty-media area of art and a minimum of two semesters ( 6 credits) in a second area. Areas of selection are drawing, painting, sculpture, printmaking, ceramics, photography, and visual design. Art majors must complete a basic fine arts course that satisfies the University/state core requirement from outside the Department of Art.
