1. Changing any and all references of 124 hrs to 120 within the Studio Art, Art BFA requirements per compliance with Act 747.
2. Adding the phrase "Bolded courses from the list below may be applied to portions of the University/state minimum core requirements" and bolding PHIL 2003. This is to clarify that students may "double dip" and completion of PHIL 2003 also satisfies a University/state core humanities requirement.
3. Changing the minimum number of required hours to 88 from 87 and the minimum of art electives from 23 to 24 , because, effectively, there really is not any scenario where a student would be able to take only 23 credit hours of art elective courses. This just makes it more "up front" and clear how many hours a student really ends up having to take to fulfill the art BFA studio art major requirements. This appears to add one credit hour to the major requirements, but does not in actual practice since students have been required to take 24 hours of art elective courses to fulfill the minimum requirement. 4. ARHS 4933 Contemporary Art is replacing ARHS 4943 as one of the 3 required ARHS courses for the major. ARHS 4943 was a seminar-style course in art history criticism; contemporary art was addressed as a component of that course. ARHS 4933 Contemporary Art provides a more focused and sustained examination of contemporary art, a subject that is of importance to all Art, BFA students.
4. Correction necessary in the 8 -semester to state that the primary concentration requires 18 , not 9 hours, to bring in line with actual major requirements.
5. Some changes to the 8 -semester plan giving students options between classes taught in the fall and spring terms to provide more flexibility to the students and to the department for advising and enrollment management .
