After having advised now for nearly a year on the new major requirements, we have agreed in WLLC to simplify and streamline a bit our additional major requirements. This is primarily to eliminate some odd interactions between our additional major requirements and the state minimum core, which we had not anticipated because we had never advised from or used just the state minimum core (we were using rather, the Fulbright College core, very different): for example, the fact that a 2003-numbered world language course counts in the core under humanities and also in our new major requirements as a humanities course; or the fact that the intricacies and inconsistencies of the advanced English exemption policy make it just too complicated and impractical to implement fairly. Our intent is also to make our major requirements more directly pertinent to world language issues, and to make the attainment of a world language double or triple major more straightforward to achieve for students wishing to do so. The change in the total # of hours required for a degree from 124 to 120 is due to a state-wide mandate.
