Transportation and Logistics Supply Chain Management Major Requirements

The major in supply chain management has two concentrations: (I) Transportation & Logistics and (II) Retail Supply Chain Management.

The transportation and logistics concentration is designed to prepare students for careers in carrier management and logistics management. Carrier management is the management of the domestic and international modes of transportation. Logistic management

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applies analytical techniques and uses the systems approach in managing the flow of materials into and through the production and manufacturing processes of a firm to its customers. Basic employment opportunities exist in marketing, sales, and operations positions with carriers in all transportation modes, and in positions with shippers having responsibility in one or more of the areas under logistics management, warehousing, packaging, and materials handling. Opportunities also exist in governmental agencies.

The retail supply chain management concentration is designed to prepare students for careers at retailers or in companies that manufacture, sell, and distribute consumer goods to retailers. Analytical techniques and the total cost approach will be applied in managing the flow of materials through production & distribution processes and to retailers. There will be an emphasis on business process integration.
