9-19). The course content in the General Nutrition minor is a duplication of course requirements in the Dietetics

Graduates of this program who choose not to apply for a post-baccalaureate dietetic internship are eligible upon completion of the Bachelor's degree to take the board examination to become a Dietetic Technician, Registered (DTR).

Students majoring in Food, Human Nutrition and Hospitality with a concentration in Dietetics are not eligible for the General Nutrition minor due to course duplication.
