3. attained a cumulative grade-point average in all college or University course work of at least 3.50 without grade renewal;
4. attained a LSAT score of at least 159.
A student who has satisfied these requirements may substitute law school course work for the remaining total hours required for the
bachelor's degree in agricultural business. It is a requirement of the Law School's accrediting standards that no student
be admitted to Law School until they have completed at least three-fourths of the work necessary for the baccalaureate degree. The
