## International Economics and Business Concentration

The major in International Economics requires 21 hours of major and collateral courses in the discipline as well as satisfying the other requirements for the B.S.B.A. degree. A maximum of 27 hours is allowed in the Economics major or discipline field of study (i.e., core, major, electives) unless the extra course is part of an interdisciplinary minor or collateral track. See an adviser for selection of courses. The courses required for the international economics and business concentration include those required in Walton College and Fulbright College. In addition, 21 hours of

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economics and business courses, nine hours of a single foreign language and six hours at the 3000 level or higher jn the same foreign language are specified, and six hours of upper division courses in the Fulbright College in an area of study related to the foreign language studied.
