Since 1997, the Walton College has incoporated COMM 1313, Public Speaking (a course requirement for all business majors), into our Freshmen Business Connections (FBC) program. As a retention initiative for new freshmen, students enrolled in common courses their first semester which included COMM 1313, WCOB 1012, Business Law (now BLAW 2013), WCOB 1111, Freshmen Business Connections, and the Computer Competency Requirement (formally ISYS 1121, Introduction to Computer Information Systems). In addition, to meet our college learning objective for Communication (effectively organize and communicate (both written and oral) business information so that it can be understood by individuals with diverse backgrounds, capabilities and interests) for our AACSB Accreditation and Assurance of Learning -Communication, the Walton College required COMM 1313 as a pre-requisite to WCOB 1033, Data Analysis and Interpretation and subsequent sophomore level courses. However, effective fall 2013, we were no longer able to reserve/block seats for our Walton College freshmen in COMM 1313 in their first semester prior to WCOB 1033. The Walton College Undergraduate Programs Committee determined we would require COMM 1313 as a pre or co-requisite to WCOB 1033 for fall 2013 until further review of our curriculum and our compliance with our Assurance of Learning objective for Communication can be addressed. Therefore, all ACT 1014, Eight Semester plans need to reflect this change.
