**The Accrediting Council on Education in Journalism and Mass Communication previously had a requirement that all journalism undergraduate degree programs have 84-85 hours of \*non\*-Journalism classes. When 8-semester plans were mandated by the state of Arkansas, the Journalism BA major (JOURBA) had to build in elective hours in the 8-semester plan that had to be a non-JOUR course in order to ensure that students fulfilled this requirement of completing 84-85 hours of non-JOUR courses. The other 83 hours of non-JOUR courses were already built into the degree program due to state core requirements, specific journalism major requirements for non-JOUR courses, and the English courses required for the English-portion of this combined major.**

**ACEJMC has now reduced the number of hours required outside of journalism to 72 hours in accredited programs. It doesn’t change the number of required hours of journalism classes. Generally speaking, journalism degree programs are now able to provide some additional flexibility for journalism majors to take more journalism classes (12-13 hours maximum) if desired.**

**The only impact this reduction in the required number of non-JOUR hours (now 72) has on this particular JORNBA major is that we will no longer have to specify that non-JOUR general electives be a non-JOUR class. It can be a general elective of any kind. The original requirements for the major remain unchanged.**
