Criminal Justice is a growing interdisciplinary field with large societal impact. Knowledge of justice system functions and processes and the causes, correlates, and consequences of criminal behavior is applicable for improved outcomes across a variety of agencies, industries, and organizations. Thus, while some students may not necessarily want to pursue justice careers consistent with a criminal justice major, education in criminal justice can nonetheless enhance or complement their major degrees in other disciplines and fields of study, including, but not limited to, sociology, social work, education and health professions, law, psychology, world languages, and computer engineering.
